



West Point—Clay County Arts Council Norman Armstrong Arts in Education Mini-Grant Program 2023-24

Guidelines and Eligibility

The Arts in Education Mini-Grant Program of the West Point—Clay County Arts Council is designed to facilitate and advance the arts as an integral component of the education and experience of K-12 students and educators in West Point and Clay County.

Teachers in both public and private schools may apply for mini-grants to support art experiences in the visual arts, music, drama, dance, or creative writing. Grant money can be used for supplies, teaching materials or equipment exclusive to the arts, tickets or admission to arts performances, teacher training workshops in arts education, or other activity that will enhance the integration of the arts into the classroom.

Guidelines

- Deadline for 2023-2024: Postmarked by **January 17, 2024**
- Funds are disbursed to the school business office
- Funds must be spent during the school year of the request.
- Funds may not be spent on standard classroom supplies.
- A follow-up report on the project is to be submitted within two weeks of a dated event or at the end of the semester for general support.

Eligibility

- All schools (K-12), both public and private operating in West Point and Clay County.
- All teachers in all subjects. Fine Arts teachers are especially encouraged to apply.
- Priority will be given to schools which demonstrate the most need and which have not already received funding the past school year.
